

Descent Of The Shedfield Estate

'It has been through the interest and enthusiasm of the late Richard Phillimore in archaeology and local history that Shedfield House and its estate has become one of the most closely studied pieces of historical landscape in Hampshire.'

Except for short breaks in the 16th and 17th centuries, the estate was held in copy of the Bishopric of Winchester between 1285 and 1867, forming part of the tithing of Shedfield in the manor of Droxford.
